"Aiding and Abetting Mother Nature's Hit-Squad"



Mike will discuss how your landscape and gardens can be a refuge for beneficial insects that provide the vital ecosystem service of biological control, the natural system of putting a beatdown on plant-damaging pests. You'll meet various beneficial insects and other arthropod allies. Learn simple steps to enhance their abundance and contributions as well as ways to conserve them in gardens. Mike will also talk about organic approaches to managing key insect and mite pests, including the use of OMRI listed insecticides.
